

The students have been working hard to practise their poems, readings and choral speaking. Ms Bearcroft has provided after school drama workshops for the students to refine their skills. The Speech and Drama festival involves cross curricular activities to support literacy and skills in the Arts. We wish all our participants the very best for their performances.

Last Friday, our school participated in the Interschool Cross Country carnival. I would like to congratulate all of our runners on the superb

effort that they put into running for our school. St Patrick's finished second, which is an improvement on last year's result. Our runners were supported by Miss Ackland and staff at school with extra training



in the mornings. This has really helped to improve their stamina over the long distances. We

Not content with sending her sisters to the ends of the earth, she set out as soon as possible to visit them, enduring long sea voyages, sickness and shipwrecks. The sisters' motto was apparent to all their students who often scribed 'AMDG' on the top of their pages. The abbreviation of Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam (for the greater glory of



God), meaning to strive to give God more glory by always doing what is more pleasing to him.

Our multi-purpose room will be set up like an old classroom with desks and books kindly borrowed from the Katanning Museum with the support of Gerri Watson. The students will not be using technology on OLSM Day and we will be playing many old fashioned games in the undercover area. We will have a liturgy to celebrate the Sisters of the Mission on the grotto lawn commencing at 9.00 am.

St Patrick's School is now calling for enrolments for Kindergarten and Pre Primary to Year 6 in 2018. Interested parents should contact the school for enrolment forms. Closing date for applications is **Friday 23rd June 2017**.

Kindergarten forms part of St Patrick's School, and as a Catholic school, will support the development of the individual, through providing many varied play and learning opportunities, including the Religious Education programme.

The Kindergarten programme will challenge and enrich a child's thinking, nurture their creativity and expand their view of their own physical world.

The Kindergarten operates from a purpose built early childhood centre, with excellent facilities and equipment. An Early Childhood trained Teacher, together with a Teacher's Assistant, implements the Kindergarten Programme. A specialised programme operates in Oral Language and Fundamental Movement skills.

All children who are born between 1 July 2013 to 30 June 2014 are eligible to be enrolled.

LEAD - Defining our Strategic Direction

<u>Learning</u>: When we are thinking about learning, our minds tend to focus mostly on the curriculum subject areas- Maths, English, Science, etc. Learning is much more than that. There are so many elements that make up our learning journey. In Year 3, we have been doing a lot of work on social and emotional learning, focusing on how to work cooperatively and collaboratively. We have been playing team building games, and discussing the importance of working together. By doing this, we are learning new life skills every day, which is so important. *Miss Lilleyman*.

<u>Engagement</u>: We have recently joined the year 5 and 6 classes in what we have coined 'Chocolate maths'. The eagerness of the students before, during and after these short rotations is fabulous to see. They are engaged for the full duration of the rotations and come into class with their minds switched to thinking mathematically. *Miss Anderson*.

Accountability: In Year 5 we have been trialling some flexible seating in our classroom. During the day, students get the opportunity to choose where they would like to complete their work and who they would like to work with. They can choose to work independently, with a partner or small group in different areas of the room such as the back desks, front mat or in the hall. The students are accountable for their own learning as they make a choice about where they would work best and who they would work productively with. It has been wonderful to see some mature choices being made in our classroom. *Miss Anderton*.

<u>Discipleship:</u> While at the interschool cross country on Friday, I was privileged to see the children display good sportsmanship, while competing and trying their hardest and encouraging others. One of our senior students showed what discipleship looked like by encouraging a fellow competitor who was finding it difficult, he called to this boy saying "come on mate, you can do it" this boy displayed leadership and discipleship. 

Community Notices







Colds

Upper respiratory tract infections or colds are everywhere, especially in winter, so it is almost impossible to stop children from catching them. Here are some points which may help:

- Teach your child to cough or sneeze into his/her elbow, and to wash hands straight afterwards.
- Hands should be washed after blowing noses and before eating.
- Use tissues once and then throw them in the bin. (Avoid using handkerchiefs.)
- Keep your child home from school if he/she has a cold/cough/fever/pain.
- Make sure that your children eat a balanced diet of plenty of healthy foods.
- Keep children away from smoke it irritates their eyes and nasal passages, making it more likely that they will catch a cold.

What to do if your child gets a cold

No treatment will cure a cold or make it go away more quickly, but you can help your child feel more comfortable:

- Rest: This need not be in bed.
- Provide extra drinks: If your child doesn't want to drink much, try giving lots of small sips of water, milk or juice, or ice blocks to suck for older children.
